## Taking care of your *Corian solid surface* is important to maintain its natural beauty.

- Daily Cleaning: Wipe the surface with a damp cloth and a mild soap or detergent. Avoid using harsh
  chemicals or abrasive cleaners, as these can damage the surface.
- Stain Removal: For tougher stains, use a non-abrasive household cleaner. Apply the cleaner to the stain, let it sit for a few minutes, and then gently scrub with a soft sponge or cloth. Rinse thoroughly with water.
- Preventing Damage: Always use cutting boards for chopping or slicing to avoid scratching the surface.
   Place hot pots and pans on trivets or heat pads to prevent thermal damage.
- Dealing with Scratches: Minor scratches can be buffed out with a fine-grit sandpaper or a specialized
  Corian repair kit. After sanding, polish the area with a Corian polish or a non-abrasive polish to restore its
  shine.
- Avoiding Excessive Moisture: While Corian is non-porous and resistant to stains, standing water can
  cause damage over time. Wipe up spills promptly and avoid leaving wet cloths or sponges on the surface for
  extended periods.
- Regular Maintenance: Periodically, you can use a Corian cleaner or a mild abrasive cleaner to maintain
  the surface's luster. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for the best results.
