## **SOAPSTONE**Care | Maintenance Card



## Taking care of your *soapstone* is important to maintain its natural beauty.

- Daily Cleaning: Wipe down the soapstone countertop with a damp cloth and a mild dish soap. Avoid using harsh chemical cleaners, as they can damage the stone's surface.
- Stain Prevention: Soapstone is naturally non-porous, making it resistant to stains. However, it's still
  wise to wipe up spills promptly, especially those from acidic substances like lemon juice or wine.
- Oil Application: To enhance the natural darkening process and maintain a uniform appearance, apply
  a thin layer of mineral oil to the countertop every few months. Use a soft cloth to spread the oil evenly
  and then wipe off any excess.
- Scratch Management: Soapstone is softer than other countertop materials, so it can get scratched.
   Small scratches can be easily removed with a gentle sanding using fine-grit sandpaper, followed by a reapplication of mineral oil.
- Avoiding Heat Damage: While soapstone is heat-resistant, it's good practice to use trivets or hot pads
  under hot pots and pans to avoid any potential thermal shock to the stone.
- Periodic Maintenance: Every few years, consider giving your soapstone countertop a more thorough
  maintenance check. Lightly sand any areas that look dull or scratched, then apply mineral oil to
  rejuvenate the surface.
